Don and Sharon Heck become genealogical researchers in Connecticut!

During a recent trip to Connecticut to see their son Steve, Don and Sharon Heck took up the challenge to help out with some of our family research. I had asked if they and/or Steve could check some records at Voluntown, Connecticut, and perhaps look through a few cemeteries in the area.

Voluntown is a relatively short distance from Groton where Steve Heck lives and works as a research chemist for Pfizer.

Our research into the Burgess side of our family indicated that Benajah Burgess, son of John Burgess, may have lived in Voluntown in the late 1700's. This was like looking for a needle in a hay-stack. Chances of them finding anything was rather slim.

Don and Sharon spent several hours walking through cemeteries but without much luck. While checking at an archives however they really hit a gold mine of information. They found a land transfer record from December 25, 1787, in which John Burgess transferred land in Voluntown to his son Benajah Burgess for the sum of six hundred pounds. Witnesses to the transaction included a brother and a sister of Benajah.


While Don and Sharon were bit by the genealogy bug, they didn't quite catch the "disease." Sharon said later that it was a lot of fun but that she and Don really didn't know what they were looking for.

A transcript of the land transfer record is on the last page of this news letter. Can you imagine trying to find that land today considering the way that it was described in 1787?

We know from the land record that John Burgess was not able to read or write or to even sign his own name. He used his "seal" to legalize the document in place of a signature. His seal was a hand drawn face.

Meet Mary Ann McNulty Heck 1844 - 1912

Mary Ann McNulty was born at Brighton, Kenosha County, Wisconsin on March 11, 1844. She was the second child of Peter McNulty and Patience Burgess. Mary Ann had six brothers and five sisters. Two of her brothers died at an early age and her younger sister Julia was killed at the age of five from a blow to the head by a thrown rock.

By 1850 Mary Ann was living with her family in the town of Pike in Kenosha County. By 1860 the McNulty family was living on a farm about a half mile south of St. Francis Xavier Catholic church at Brighton. The farm was on the same road as the church. The land is still being farmed today, but all that remains of the original farm house is part of the foundation.

On January 16, 1869, Mary Ann McNulty was married to Civil War veteran, Henry Heck at St. Francis Xavier church in Brighton Among other places, Mary Ann and Henry lived in Dover, Kansasville, and Burlington, all in Racine County, Wisconsin. She must have been a patient person to have put up with Henry and his get rich quick schemes over the years. She stood by him when he gave up farming to become a saloon keeper in Kansasville. That escapade only lasted a few months, but Henry doubled his money in that time. You can almost hear Henry in his German accent telling her, "Sees Du! Ich told you so."

The picture of Mary Ann at left was probably taken about 1900. The studio photograph was found in a suitcase in a barn in Waterford along with other pictures owned by Lizzie Heck Plucker, daughter of Mary Ann and Henry Heck.

Mary Ann died on April 7, 1912 at Burlington. Her obituary follows:

"Death came as a relief to end the sufferings of Mrs. Henry Heck, who died at her home in Burlington on Sunday morning, aged 68 years. She was afflicted with cancer and for years had been a patient sufferer but bore the affliction with true christian fortitude. Mrs. Heck was born in Somers, Kenosha county, and her maiden name was Mary McNulty. She was a loving, dutiful wife, a devoted mother, a kind neighbor and one respected and esteemed by all. The past sixteen years the family resided in Burlington but prior to that lived in Dover and Brighton and have many acquaintances and friends. Besides the aged husband five sons and three daughters mourn her loss, viz: Robert and Matt, of Racine; Lawrence, of Milwaukee; John, of Waterford; James Heck, Mrs. Alfred Plucker, Mrs. A. Grosstueck and Miss Eva Heck, of Burlington. The funeral was held from St. Charles church at Burlington yesterday"

Mary Ann McNulty Heck is buried beside her husband at the St. Mary's cemetery, Burlington, Wisconsin.


The sun was at a steep angle and cast shadows on their faces so it was necessary to use flash attachments.

The transfer of land from John Burgess to his son, Benajah Burgess at Voluntown, Connecticut, in 1787.

"To all people to whom these presents shall come Greeting. Know ye that I John Burgis of Volluntown in the County of Windham in the State of Connecticut for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred pounds Lawfull money to me in hand Before the Ensealing of these presents well and truly paid by Benajah Burgis of Volluntown in the County afore sd, the Receipt whereof I Do acknowledge and my self there with Satisfyed and have given granted Bargained and Sold and Do by these presents give grant Bargain sell and convey and confirm unto him the said Benaiah Burgis his heirs and assigns forever two certain tracts of Land Lying in Volluntown in the County afore said one of which Lots contains by Estimation fifty acres be the same more or Less and is Bounded as followeth (viz) Begining at a white oak tree marked which is Joshua Spencer Southwest corner of that Lot that his house stands on in Ebenezer Smiths South Line thence westerly to John Russells Land to a meer stone thence East by a Lot of Joshua Spencers Land to a meer Stone then South by sd Spencers Land a straight Line to a small Brook to a meer stone on the Bank thence Southwest to a white oak stump by sd Spencers Land then runing northwest by said Spencers Land to John Russells southeast corner to a stake and stones then runing southwest by John Russells Land to a Black oak tree on the Bank of the River then up the stream of said river as it now runeth to a great Rock Just Below Smiths mill then Easterly by sd Smiths Land untill it comes to the Highway that Leads to Providence. Still by said Road untill it comes to Robert Montgomerys Land to a stake and stones thence north by sd Montgomery Land to where two Brooks meets thence Runing up the northermost Brook by said Montgomerys Land to Joshua Spencers Land to a heap of stones thence west to the Bounds first mentioned."

"The next or second Lot contains about one hundred and thirty acres be the same more or Less Bounded as followith (viz) Begining at a heap of stones northwest of Joshua Spencers house in Ebenezer Smiths north line thence Runing north by the Road that Leads north to Esqr Coles till it comes to Thomas Greens South East corner to a stake and stones which is a corner thence it runs in the South Line of sd Greens Land westerly to his South West corner and then Southerly in the old Line of parke and church to Asa Montgomerys Land then Easterly by sd Montgomerys Land to Ebenezer Smiths northwest corner then by sd Smiths Land to the Bounds first mentioned. To have and to hold the sd granted and Bargained premises with all the previledges and appurtenances there unto Belonging to him the said Benajah Burgis his heirs and assigns forever as an absolute Estate of Inheritance forever and I the sd John Burgis for my self my heirs Executors and administrators Do covenant and ingage the above and before Demised premises to him the sd Benajah Burgis his heirs and assigns against the Lawfull Claims and Demands of any person or persons whatsoever forever hereafter to warrant and Defend by these presents in witness whereof I the sd John Burgis have here unto set my hand and seal this 25th Day of December AD 1787 Signed Sealed and Delivered in the presence of us."

John Burgis (His Seal)

Before Robert Dixson, Justice of the Peace
