This year we will celebrate the 30th consecutive family picnic and reunion at the light house at Wind Point, Wisconsin. Wind Point is located just north of the city of Racine, Wisconsin. The date for this years picnic is Sunday, July 20, 1997. Henningfeld researchers have joined forces:

Through the Internet, I have made contact with Henningfeld family researchers from around the world who are all researching the same family originating in Heinrichenburg, Germany in the late 1600's. Jeff Henningfield lives in Washington State, Henning Henningfeld lives in Venezuela, Martin Kriszio lives in Heinrichenburg, Dr. Kempkes lives in Saarbruken, Germany, and Katja Henningfeld lives in Berlin, Germany. Martin Kriszio is a writer and just published two articles in a German newspaper. One of the articles was about me and the extensive research that I have done on the American branches of the Henningfeld family. The second article was about Henning Henningfeld and his extensive research into the German Henningfeld families.

Martin Kriszio sent the picture in this article by E-Mail over the Internet to me. The picture shows the Henningfeld Gasthof (a restaurant) in 1920, Heinrichenburg, Germany. According to Martin, the Gasthof is no longer there as it was torn down to make way for a new highway.

Our Henningfeld ancestors lived in Heinrichenburg and later in Vinnum, Germany. The entire branch moved to Wisconsin in 1845 and 1847. One of those branches changed the spelling of the name to Henningfield.




If you get a chance, check it out. I have contributed a great deal of our Burgess research to their home

 James Henry HECK was born 1 Nov 1869 in Dover, Racine Co., WI. He died 29 Sep 1943 in Burlington, Racine Co., WI and was buried in Burlington, Racine Co., WI.

> James Henry Heck was the son and first child of Henry Heck and Mary Ann McNulty.

BIOGRAPHY: James Henry Heck was a house painter by trade and lived nearly all of his life in the city of Burlington, Wisconsin. A large family reunion was held at his home in 1948. Fear of polio in the late 1940's and early 1950's put an end to the reunions. James Henry Heck 1869 - 1943

Wilhelmina lived on the East side of the Fox river at the time of her marriage in 1903. She was married at St. Mary's Catholic church in Burlington. She was known as Minnie.

> BIOGRAPHY: Raymond James Heck attended grade school and graduated from high school in Burlington, WI. Raymond was an electrician and worked for the Rewald Electric Co. from 1925 to 1931. He started his own company in 1931, called the Ray J. Heck Electric Co. and retired in 1990.
