Eugene B. "Gene" Heck September 18, 1938 -April 6, 2017


Eugene Bernard Heck, "Gene", age 78, passed away Thursday, April 06, 2017, at the Clement Zablocki

Mark Your Calendar... Sunday, July 9, 2017, The Heck Picnic at the Leisure Center. The Heck Family Picnic will be held at the Leisure Center near Wind Point, Racine, Wisconsin. The golf outing at Shoop's Park is still a central activity as is swimming in the outdoor pool at the Leisure Center.

Originally the Heck Picnic was for descendants of Henry Heck (1839-1920) and Mary Ann McNulty (1844-1912) and included family members from Racine, Waterford and Burlington. The first recorded picnic took place in 1948 at Brown's Lake at Burlington, Wisconsin. There were probably many earlier picnics dating back to the post-Civil War period. Henry and Mary Ann were married in 1869 and it is almost certain that they had picnics in Burlington and in Waterford.

<u>Meet your distant lost</u> <u>cousins.</u>

Peter McNulty and Patience Burgess had 13 children between 1840 and 1869. Part of genealogy research involves trying to find out what happened to each of those 13 children.

The third child of Peter and Patience was Adaline McNulty, sometimes shown as Adeline McNulty. Adaline was born in Kenosha County, Wisconsin in 1845.

Adaline McNulty was found in the 1850 census for Pike, Kenosha County, Wisconsin at the age of 5 years.

In the 1860 census she was listed as Adaline McNulty age 16 years but was indexed on Ancestry.com as Adaline Nulty. She married John Newman on 5 Jun 1861 at the age of 17 years at St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church located at Brighton, Kenosha County, Wisconsin.

John Newman and Adaline McNulty had six children as follows:

(1) Mary N. Newman born 1862,

(2) Daniel W. Newman born 1864,

- (3) Julia Newman born 14 March 1867,
- (4) Bennett Newman born 17 October 1869,
- (5) Adelaid N Newman born 29 August 1872,

(6) John William Newman born 6 December 1877.

Bennett Newman (4) was also known as Benjamin and as Bernard Newman in later records.

John Newman died on 10 February 1879 at Burlington, Racine County, Wisconsin leaving Adaline alone with six young children.

Adaline McNulty Newman was found in the 1870 and 1880 census. However, no record of her could be found in the 1900 census or beyond. The 1880 census shows her as a widow and her age is shown as 34.

After 1880 Adaline McNulty Newman seemed to disappear from the face of the earth. There were a lot of possibilities. She could have died at an early age or she could have remarried since she was only 34 years old when her husband died in 1879. Many years of searching took place but she was not to be found anywhere in Wisconsin.

While researching in the Burlington, Wisconsin Historical Society records recently, I found reference to one of Adaline's sons, Benjamin Newman, who visited Burlington after living in California for 24 years. The reference on the Burlington web page stated:

"Benjamin; S 7/11/1908 - visited after 24 years in Calif.; S 8/15/08 - returned to Calif." The reference S 7/11/1908 is for the newspaper, The Burlington Standard Press 11 July 1908.

Benjamin was born on 17 October 1869 thus he would have been 14 years old when he left Wis-

consin for California. It is unlikely that a 14 year old boy would leave Wisconsin alone for a life in California.

The next logical step was to search for Adaline and her remaining family in California.

Adeline J Newman was found in the 1910 census living in Lexington, Los Angeles County, California with her son, Daniel W. Newman. She was found in the 1920 census living at Seal Beach, Orange County, California.

A search of the FindaGrave web site found Adeline Newman buried in Wittier, California. The record showed that she was born in 1842 and died in 1923. Her burial was at Rose Hills Memorial Park, Whittier, Los Angeles County, California, USA.

Plot: Mausoleum I - Crypts, Section 1, Grave 205.

 Mary N. Newman married William C. Davis and she died in 1923 and is buried near her mother in Plot: Mausoleum I - Crypts, Section 1, Grave 201. Her husband, William C. Davis died in 1931 and he is buried in Plot: Mausoleum I -Crypts, Section 1, Grave 200.

(2) Daniel W. Newman died on 20 November 1936 and is buried at Rose Hills Memorial Park, Whittier, Los Angeles County, California, USA. He never married.

(3) Julia Newman married Nicholas Smith on 5 January 1888 at the San Gabriel Mission, Los Angeles, California. We were unable to find her death or burial records.

(4) Benjamin Newman married Mabel L Jones on 30 July 1914 at Santa Ana, California. On his marriage certificate from California, his name was shown as Bernard Newman. The marriage certificate stated that he was born in Wisconsin and was 40 years old in 1914. His parents were shown as John Newman and Adaline McNulty. The certificate incorrectly listed his mother's birth place as Maine. She was born in Wisconsin. Bernard was probably confusing his mother's birth place with his grandmother's birthplace. A record of his death and burial have not been found.

(5) Adelaid N. Newman married Elbert J Dodson on 27 October 1897 at El Monte, Los Angeles, California. She died on 6 January 1933 in Orange County, California. Elbert J. Dodson died on 31 January 1935 at Rosemead, Los Angeles County, California.


(6) John William Newman was single and living with his mother at the time of the World War I draft registration. WWI Draft Registration 2 SEP 1918: Living at home with his mother at 122 14th Street Seal Beach, Orange County, California. The draft record indicated that his age was 40 years in 1918. It is believed that he remained single and died in California.

In conclusion, an obscure entry in the Burlington, Wisconsin Historical Society web page about Benjamin Newman visiting Burlington after 24 years let to the discovery of a missing branch of our McNulty family. "Benjamin; S 7/11/1908 - visited after 24 years in Calif.; S 8/15/08 - returned to Calif." *********

Burlington Free Press 29 SEP 1943:

James Heck, 73, Dies After Short Illness.

James Heck, 73, son of Henry Heck, Civil War veteran, died at 11:30pm Wednesday. Mr. Heck had been a resident of Burlington for many years.

He was born Nov. 1, 1869, on a farm in the town of Brighton, Kenosha County, and spent his entire life in that vicinity, later moving to Burlington. His wife, the former, Wilhelmina Hoerneman, died in 1919. Mr. Heck, a painter by trade, had been in poor health for the past 10 years, but was not confined to his bed until a week prior to his death. He was a member of St. Mart's Catholic church, and the Holy Name society of that parish. Friends will gather at the McCarthy funeral home at 8pm Friday to pray the rosary. Surviving Mr. Heck are four children, Ray Heck and Herbert Heck, Burlington; Mrs. Nick Pier, Racine, and Corp. Joseph Heck, at Camp Shelby, Miss., who will be home for the funeral. He is also survived by two sisters, Miss Eva Heck and Mrs. Alfred Plucker, Waterford; a brother, Laurence Heck, Milwaukee; a cousin, Miss Anna Hugenin, and seven grandchildren.
